On Monday, January 1, 2024, at approximately 11:54 p.m., Henrico Police responded to the 2000 block of Montbrook Lane for a reported burglary. As officers were enroute to the location, information about a shooting at that address was reported. Once on scene, officers located two adult females inside an apartment with apparent gunshot wounds.

One adult female was pronounced deceased at the scene. She has been identified as **Shante M. Jones, 34, of Henrico**. The second victim was transported to an area hospital with life-threatening injuries where she remains in critical condition.

Currently, detectives are following up on leads in this investigation.

Henrico Police Outfits Division with New Uniforms

(Henrico County, Va.) – The Henrico County Police Division is outfitting new uniforms for our sworn personnel.

Locally and nationwide, policing has changed over the years. From different vehicles to upgraded equipment – the needs of Henrico County have evolved over the Police Division's 89-year existence, along with the type of crimes being investigated.

Another change is in the process, aiming to serve our community members better and prevent physical setbacks for our sworn personnel in the coming years.

Before Chief Eric D. English arrived in Henrico County, there were conversations about updating the Division's police uniforms. Those conversations have now become a reality.

Since 1936, officers have worn blue/grey uniforms. Given only a few changes over the decades since 1940, such as the design of shoulder patches and the position of the shirt badge, the uniform has remained the same. As of 2024, the Henrico County Police Division will move forward in this new era of policing in brandnew uniforms. These uniforms will better regulate body temperature during the summer, are more comfortable and will look consistent in color (French Blue) Division-wide.

"The duty uniforms you may see our patrol wear with an outer vest are also meant to distribute the weight of equipment our officers carry, on a daily basis," said **Henrico Chief of Police Eric D. English.** "The health and safety of each of our sworn personnel is paramount. These new uniforms will hopefully add to the longevity of service within the Division and avoid any physical setbacks later on."

Beyond the physical uniforms, Henrico Police is focused on creating a Division reflective of the county it serves. In November 2020, under Chief English's leadership, the <u>personal appearance and grooming policy</u> was updated. This modernized policy allows our sworn personnel to express who they are and perhaps connect with our community members on another level while instilling confidence in the Division and its members of the public.





"While the uniforms of our sworn personnel may be changing, the vision, mission and values within the Division remain the same," said **Henrico Police spokesperson Lt. Amy Kelley**. "We are committed to serving our community each and every day and look forward to creating and building upon the relationships we have with our community members."

Several officers in patrol are currently outfitted in these new uniforms; the rollout process is expected to continue over the next year. As a result, our community members may see our patrol officers outfitted in two different uniforms.

Arrest made in Montbrook Lane Homicide

Update 1:

(Henrico County, Va.) – Authorities have arrested a Richmond man in connection to the Montbrook Lane homicide.

During the investigation, **Rajahn Altariq Heath, 33, of Richmond**, was developed as a suspect. On Monday evening he was taken into custody by FBI Newark's Violent Crimes Task Force and SWAT agents in Newark, NJ. Mr. Heath was arraigned this morning in Essex County (New Jersey) and is being held on an Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution (UFAP) warrant, awaiting extradition to Henrico County.

Mr. Heath has been charged with the following:

- Murder, 2nd Degree
- Use of Firearm in Commission of a Felony x2
- Malicious Wounding
- Possession of Firearm by Convicted Felon

"We are grateful for the assistance of FBI Newark and FBI Richmond's Central Virginia Violent Crimes Task Force in helping locate and apprehend Mr. Heath," said **Henrico Police spokesperson Lt. Amy Kelley**. "The cooperation between local and state agencies is crucial to ensuring public safety."


Henrico Police Seeks Suspect in Connection to Engleside Drive Homicide

Fatal Auto vs Pedestrian Crash on Staples Mill Road

(Henrico County, Va.) - Henrico Police is investigating a fatal crash involving a pedestrian.

On Monday, January 29, 2024, at approximately 2 a.m., Henrico Police responded to the intersection of Staples Mill Road and Bremner Boulevard for a reported vehicle versus pedestrian crash.

The preliminary investigation appears to show the driver of a Toyota RAV4 struck a pedestrian in the westbound lanes of Staples Mill Road between Bremner Boulevard and Sprenkle Lane. The suspect then drove away from the scene. Officers located the vehicle with the driver inside roughly two miles away. The juvenile male driver, age 17, was taken into custody.

The pedestrian, an adult male, was taken to an area hospital with life-threatening injuries where he later died. Henrico Police has identified the victim as **Andre Antonio Messado**, **27**, **of New Jersey**.

At this time, alcohol appears to be a contributing factor in the crash.

The juvenile male has been issued petitions of:

- DUI
- Felony Hit and Run
- Involuntary Manslaughter
- Possessing a Fake ID
- Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle

Additionally, the suspect was issued a summons for operating a vehicle without a license. He is currently being held at the Henrico County Juvenile Detention Home.

Rabies Clinic Scheduled for February 10

(**Henrico County, Va.**) – The Henrico County Police Division will hold a rabies vaccination clinic for dogs and cats from *9 a.m. to noon on Saturday, February 10* at the Henrico County Western Government Complex (4301 E. Parham Road).

Pet owners must register and pay at the cashier's office in the Administration Building before seeing a veterinarian on the first level of the adjacent parking deck.

Each vaccine costs \$15 and must be paid in cash. A rabies tag and a certificate of inoculation are included. Pets from all localities are welcome. Cats must be in carriers.

Under Virginia law, dogs and cats four months of age and older must be vaccinated for rabies.

Henrico dog licenses will also be available for \$10. Licenses are valid for the life of the animal while the owner lives in Henrico and its rabies vaccinations are kept current. Officers will be available to discuss license and vaccination requirements.

Henrico Police Investigates Fatal Brook Road Pedestrian Crash

UPDATE 1

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police continues to investigate a deadly auto vs pedestrian crash that occurred on Brook Road.

On Tuesday, February 13, 2024, at approximately 6:28 p.m., Henrico Police responded to the 9800 block of Brook Road for a reported traffic crash involving a pedestrian. Once on scene, officers located an adult female in the roadway with obvious signs of trauma. She was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Henrico Police has identified the victim as **Diamond Naketa Downs, 22, of Henrico**.

The preliminary investigation shows Ms. Downs attempted to cross the northbound lanes of Brook Road when she was struck by a Hyundai Santa Fe. The driver and passengers involved in the crash remained on the scene. Dark clothing and poor lighting in the area appear to be contributing factors in this crash.








(Henrico County, Va.) – The Henrico County Police Division will hold a rabies vaccination clinic for dogs and cats from *9 a.m. to 12 p.m. on Saturday, August 17, 2024* at the Henrico County Western Government Complex (4301 E. Parham Road).

Pet owners must register and pay at the cashier's office in the Administration Building before seeing a veterinarian on the first level of the adjacent parking deck.

Each vaccine costs \$20 and must be paid in cash. A rabies tag and a certificate of inoculation are included. Pets from all localities are welcome. Cats must be in carriers.

Under Virginia law, dogs and cats four months of age and older must be vaccinated for rabies.

Henrico dog licenses will also be available for \$10. Licenses are valid for the life of the animal while the owner lives in Henrico and its rabies vaccinations are kept current. Officers will be available to discuss license and vaccination requirements.

Henrico Police Investigates Deadly Two-Vehicle Crash

"We are at a loss for words about what unfolded last night," said **Henrico County Police Division Assistant Chief Lauren Edwards**. "Any time a crash or violent crime ends in a death is a horrible result, but to have a child as the victim is even more difficult to comprehend. Our detectives are trained to thoroughly investigate each case they are assigned, and that will continue in this instance as our community tries to heal from this tragic event."

Two investigations are currently underway related to this incident. The Henrico Police Special Victims Unit is investigating the circumstances of how the toddler left the home. The preliminary investigation indicates the child was left in the care of a babysitter. Due to the sensitive nature of this case, details will be released when appropriate.

Henrico Police to Host CALEA Assessors for Re-Accreditation Process

(Henrico County, Va.) - The Henrico County Police Division will host assessors through the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement (CALEA) next week.

The Division has been an accredited law enforcement agency by CALEA since 1987. However, in 2015, the Division set out to expand its accreditation. In March 2017, after an 18-month assessment, on-site CALEA assessments and appearing before the CALEA Board of Commissions, the Division's Law Enforcement, Basic Training Academy and Emergency Communications Center (ECC) were each accredited and the Henrico County Police Division was awarded TRI-ARC accreditation. The Division was re-accredited with the TRI-ARC designation in April 2021.

As part of the Division's mission to become re-accredited with the TRI-ARC designation in 2025, the Henrico County Police Division will host its on-site assessment by CALEA assessors from October 27 -October 31, 2024. The on-site inspection occurs every four years to validate the Division's adherence to CALEA standards.

Henrico Police remains committed to meeting any changes or new requirements in the accreditation process.

Community members can offer comments to CALEA through an online Accreditation Public Comment Portal. This portal allows citizens to share comments regarding an agency's compliance with CALEA standards, engagement in the service community, delivery of public safety services and overall candidacy for accredited status. These comments may be shared in the form of commendations or concerns.

Please note, CALEA is not an investigatory body and as a result, the portal should not be used to submit information for such purposes.

This portal is in addition to the previously created "Henrico Police Public Satisfaction Survey," which looks to improve services to the community based on feedback.

Henrico Police Investigates a Fraud/Theft Ring Targeting Home Depot Locations

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police is investigating a series of equipment thefts from a W. Broad Street Home Depot with similar cases across the metro-area.

The characteristics of these thefts are similar – the suspects ask an individual to rent a heavy piece of machinery from Home Depot, oftentimes a Boom Lift, and provide a story as to why they cannot rent it in their name(s).

Detectives in the Henrico Police Auto Theft Unit are currently investigating two cases of this nature that occurred in August 2024 at the Home Depot in the 6500 block of W. Broad Street. In both cases, the suspects never returned the machinery to the business. Detectives later recovered the equipment in a different county and/or state.

Information obtained during these investigations indicates at least three people involved in this fraud/theft ring, with the possibility of several others. Detectives have identified two of those individuals as:





New Evidence in 1987 Unsolved Rape Case; Henrico Police Seek Help from Public

(Henrico County, Va.) - The Henrico County Police Division's Cold Case Review Team has released an advanced composite of a person of interest in connection to a 1987 unsolved rape. Detectives are seeking information from the public about the identity of this man following new evidence gathered in this case due to technological advancements.

On April 13, 1987, a 22-year-old Henrico woman reported she was raped at knifepoint in her apartment in the 200 block of Carleigh Court in the Colonial Apartments complex. The investigation indicates the offender had been watching the victim as she left the apartment multiple times that day.

"The offender was waiting inside the victim's home when she returned from running an errand," said Cold Case Detective J. Schihl. "He cut through a back screen door to get inside before violating the victim."

Notably, this incident occurred between 2-3 p.m. on a Monday, in broad daylight.

"We believe this person had committed a violent act like this before," Schihl said. "In the late 1980s, there were several serial rapes that had occurred in the Metro-Richmond area."

At the time, the offender was described as a white man, mid to late 20s, roughly 5'10", 170-180 lbs (stocky), with dark brown hair and a regular mustache. During the incident, the victim said the man was wearing a work uniform, similar to one a delivery driver, maintenance worker or utility person may wear.

In 1987, Henrico Police created a composite of a person of interest. In 2024, Cold Case Detectives obtained an advanced composite of what the offender may look like now.

Additionally, due to technological advancements since the crime occurred, evidence in this case was retested with a "hit" on a new lead. Due to the sensitive nature of the case, we are unable to share specifics.

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police is investigating a string of vandalisms that occurred across Henrico County, with similar incidents in the City of Richmond.





Henrico Police Arrest/Charge Two Men in Reynolds Road Homicide

UPDATE 2:

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police has arrested two Henrico brothers in connection to Monday's homicide in the 3300 block of Reynolds Road.

On Friday, December 20, 2024, Henrico Police Detectives took Malik Rashaad Bowman Witcher, 19, and Jaquan Lamario Bowman Witcher, 20, both of Henrico, into custody. They have been charged with the following:

- Malik Rashaad Bowman Witcher
 - Second-degree murder
 - o Possession of a Firearm in the Commission of a Felony
- Jaquan Lamario Bowman Witcher
 - Second-degree murder
 - Possession of a Firearm in the Commission of a Felony

"We're thankful for the diligent efforts by our homicide detectives and multiple units within the Division who aided in taking these two suspects into custody," said **Criminal Investigations Section Lieutenant J. Fisher**. "The Henrico County Police Division remains committed to protecting and serving our community members and we hope these arrests will provide much needed relief to those in the neighborhood."

UPDATE 1 (12/27/24):

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police Detectives continue to follow up on a number of leads into Monday's homicide investigation in the 3300 block of Reynolds Road.

The preliminary investigation indicates there was gunfire reported around 3:25 a.m. on Monday. The Henrico County Department of Emergency Communications (DEC) received one 911 call at that time for a





reported shooting in the 3300 block of Reynolds Road. Once on scene, officers spoke with the homeowner who showed them damage to their property. Officers searched the immediate area and were not alerted to any injuries. Evidence was collected from the scene.

On Monday at 6:07 a.m., the DEC received a 911 call for a report of someone shot. Officers responded to the scene where they located a juvenile male (17 years old) in a fenced-in backyard of a home in the 3300 block of Reynolds Road with obvious signs of trauma. He was pronounced deceased at the scene. Due to the victim's age, Henrico Police will not be releasing his identity.

"To provide some further clarity, the victim was located a couple houses down from where officers responded for the single 911 shooting call just after 3 a.m.," said **Henrico County Police Division spokesperson Karina Bolster**. "There were no calls for active gunfire in the area at approximately 6 a.m."

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police is in the early stages of a homicide investigation in the Fairfield Magisterial District.

On Monday, December 16, 2024, at approximately 6:07 a.m., Henrico Police responded to the 3300 block of Reynolds Road for a report of someone shot. Once on scene, officers located a juvenile male (17 years old) in a backyard with obvious signs of trauma. He was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Members of our Criminal Investigations Section are on scene collecting evidence and gathering information about what unfolded.

Given the proximity of the crime scene to Harold Macon Ratcliffe Elementary, Henrico Police is coordinating with Henrico County Public Schools (HCPS) to ensure all students and staff arrive at school safely. More details about operations at the school can be directed to HCPS.

Currently, Reynolds Road is shut down between Thalen Street and Howard Street; Thalen Street is closed between Reynolds Road and Howard Road. Please anticipate these areas being closed for several hours as detectives investigate.

Henrico Police Investigate Patterson Avenue Homicide

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police is investigating a homicide that occurred in the 11200 block of Patterson Avenue.

On Sunday, December 22, 2024, at approximately 10:24 p.m., Henrico Police responded to the 11200 block of Patterson Avenue for a reported medical emergency. Once on scene, officers located an adult male in the driver's seat of his vehicle deceased from apparent gunshot wounds. Detectives from Henrico Police's Criminal Investigations Section responded to the scene and began investigating. Based on evidence collected at the scene, investigators have determined this incident to be a homicide.

Investigators have identified the victim as Michael LaShawn Wright, 33, of Henrico.

Henrico Police is working with the State's Office of the Chief Medical Examiner to determine the exact cause and manner of death.

There is currently no suspect information available as detectives continue to process evidence and follow up on leads.
