- Curfew or curfew hours refers to the hours of 11:00 PM through 6:00 AM.
- The Henrico County Code Sec. 13-151—13-153 Curfew Violation is defined as any person 16 years of age and under (who has not been emancipated by court order entered pursuant to Code of Virginia, § 16.1-333) out during curfew unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.

EXCEPTIONS TO CURFEW

“It shall be unlawful for a parent of any minor to permit, allow or encourage such minor to remain in any public place in the county during curfew, unless accompanied by the parent of such minor. This section shall not apply to minors who are engaged in the following activities:

1. Attending, or going to or returning from without detour or stop, an activity supervised by adults and sponsored by a school, civic, religious or other public organization or agency, or by another similar organization or entity;
2. Going to or returning from an employment activity without detour or stop;
3. Moving about in the event of an emergency; or
4. Exercising First Amendment rights protected by the United States Constitution, such as the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, and the right of assembly.”
