The Police Division is dedicated to keeping all of its citizens safe and protecting their rights. Fair and Impartial Policing is the Guiding Principle of the Police Division's daily operations. Basically, it means we treat all others as we would want to be treated or as we would want our family members treated.

- **Citizens Police Academies:** Twice annually, we offer a [Citizens Police Academy and a Senior Citizens Police Academy](#). Once annually, we offer a [Youth Police Academy](#). Call (804) 501-4838 to find out when the next academy will be held, and apply.
- **Volunteer Opportunities:** The Division offers many opportunities for volunteers. From Motorist Assistance to Animal Shelter support, there are many ways you can become involved and support the Division through your skills and talents.
- **Neighborhood Watch:** Find out if your neighborhood has a Neighborhood Watch. Neighborhood Watch helps to reduce the fear and incidence of crime, thus, making Henrico County a safer place to live, work, and play. It enlists the assistance of citizens as additional "eyes and ears" in each participating neighborhood to watch for any suspicious activity and immediately report all crime and suspicious activity to police. - **Business Watch Program:** Business Watch is a free, county-wide program modeled after the highly successful Neighborhood Watch program. It establishes a formal communications network among businesses in specified areas and allows Henrico Police to notify business members of potential crime and current crime trends more efficiently. - **Faith Community Coalition:** The Division is committed to protecting its citizens' rights including their freedom of religion. Its partnership with the faith community through its Faith Community

Contacting Henrico Police

Report all crime to the police - no matter how minor or embarrassing. Your actions can help others from becoming victims.

Call the non-emergency phone number, (804) 501-5000 if your problem is not life threatening. Examples: Noisy neighbors, barking dogs, and other similar problems or questions are non-emergencies.

Call 911 in an emergency only!

- Stay on the phone!
- Remain calm and tell the call taker if you need police, fire-fighters, or medical help.
- Speak slowly and clearly.
- Tell them your exact location including street name and number.
- Listen carefully to what the call taker is telling you to do, and do it.
