FREE DOCUMENT SHREDDING:

<u>DOCUMENT LIMITATIONS</u>: Free document shredding for <u>personal documents only</u>, NO recyclable paper items accepted. Limited to the following quantities and materials:

- 2 boxes (10" x 13" x 18") -OR- 3 paper grocery bags
- DO NOT USE PLASTIC BAGS, paper bags or boxes only!

FREE ELECTRONICS RECYCLING*

*FEE TO RECYCLE THE FOLLOWING: These items contain leaded glass / mercury and require special handling.

- \$23 fee for televisions less than 27"
- \$30 fee for televisions 27" or larger

<u>ITEMS ACCEPTED AT NO CHARGE</u>: computer systems (hard drives, CPU, monitor); printers; computer accessories (cables, wires, keyboards, mice, speakers, etc.); copiers; scanners; FAX machines; VCR's; camcorders; stereos; and microwave ovens.

 $\underline{\textbf{ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED}} : compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFL's), refrigerators, dehumidifiers, and AC units$

IOTE: <u>DO NOT</u> place electronic items in the bags or boxes with your shredding items. This will jam machines. Electronic recycling is separate from the document shredding.

ALL ITEMS FOR RECYCLE OR SHREDDING SHOULD BE PLACED IN A LOCATION ACCESSIBLE BY ON SITE STAFF. CITIZENS WILL NOT GET OUT OF THEIR CARS
