The 2019-20 Annual Performance Report was prepared by the County of Henrico Department of Community Revitalization, Division of Community Development.

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## Preface

The County of Henrico is a recipient of federal Community Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) annual entitlement funds through the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). A requirement of receiving these funds is to submit to HUD, within 90 days of the end of the program year, a report assessing progress in meeting the goals and objectives established in the Consolidated Plan and specific accomplishments and expenditures during the program year. The Henrico County program year is from October 1 to September 30.

The official submission of the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) is provided to HUD through the online *eCon Planning Suite* in HUD's Integrated Disbursement and Information System (IDIS). Henrico County's CAPER submission will occur by December 29, 2020.

This document provides a printed version of information submitted to HUD through IDIS. This document is not the official submission, rather it is a compilation of the on-line information submitted, using a data exporting function provided by IDIS. Once exported, that information was reformatted to accommodate errors in in the IDIS export, to provide a more user-friendly document, and to make available key informational reports used by HUD in evaluating local government programs for the year. These reports are provided as attachments to this document. Beginning with the 2016-17 CAPER, data for persons served with ESG funds is no longer provided in Section CR-65, rather is developed through the Sage HMIS Reporting Repository. A report from that system is provided directly to HUD. A copy of the report generated by that system is provided in the Appendix of this document.

## Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)

This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

Major accomplishments of Henrico County, Virginia for Program year 2019-20 include the following:

- Affordable housing was provided to 96 households through moderate home rehabilitation (12), minor home repairs (66), development of new affordable housing (1), and down payment assistance(10).
- Homelessness prevention, case management, shelter, street outreach and rapid re-housing services were provided to 734 persons and/or households. The vast majority of persons/households served were assisted with ESG or CDBG entitlement funds. The exception was 101 Henrico residents served throught the Homeward Non-congregate shelter or family shelter assisted with ESG-CV funds
- Public services, providing after-school programs, fair housing counseling or outreach, and computer equipment of training programs for homeless persons, with CDBG Entitlement funds served 248 persons. In addition, 96 persons were assisted through public service programs funded with CDBG-CV funds. These included mobile grocery delivery programs, crisis counseling, foreclosure prevention, and housing stability assistance.
- Economic development assistance resulted in the creation of 5 new jobs for low-income persons.

# Assess how the jurisdiction's use of funds, particularly CDBG, addresses the priorities and specific objectives identified in the plan, giving special attention to the highest priority activities identified.

The preservation and development of affordable housing, community economic development, mitigation and prevention of homelessness, and non-housing community development are the four high priority needs identified in the 2016 Consolidation Plan. These priorities were addressed in 2019-20 through the following programs:

- Homeowner Rehabilitation through project: HOMES. Twelve homes were completed at a total cost of \$121,542 CDBG and \$507,316 HOME.
- Emergency and minor repairs to homes owned by low/moderate-income residents through project: HOMES and Rebuilding Together Richmond. A total of 66 repairs were completed at a total cost of \$574,437 CDBG. A total of \$49,274 CDBG funds were used from PY2018 funding.
- Development of new affordable housing through CHDOs. One vacant home was purchased in PY2019-20 for the rehabilitation and/or construction of single-family dwelling for sale to lowincome, first-time homebuyers. Total expenditure of HOME (CHDO) funds from the program year 2019-20 for the one completed project was \$55,090, however this funding came from PY2018-19.
- Down payment and closing cost assistance through SCDHC to enable homeownership for lowincome first-time homebuyers. Funding was provided for eight homebuyers; one homebuyer was assisted at a total cost of \$2,250 CDBG and \$8,000 HOME.
- Down payment and closing cost assistance though HOME Inc. to enable homeownership for low-income first-time homebuyers. Funding was provided for 14 homebuyers; 9 homebuyers were assisted at a total cost of \$22,000 CDBG and \$82,353 HOME.
- After-school substance abuse and violence prevention through the CONNECT Program for at-risk youth and their parents residing in 11 low-income communities. 112 students were served throughout the program year at a total cost of \$148,681.04 CDBG.
- The job creation and retention objective was accomplished through the creation of 5 new FTE jobs for low- or moderate-income people and the support of 9 businesses owned by low- or moderate-income people through the Commercial Assistance and Enterprise Zone Design Assistance programs. PY2019-20 expenditures (including expenditures from prior year funds): \$208,368.08 CDBG. This resulted in an average of one job for every \$34,873.62 of CDBG and an average of one business supported for every \$3,777.78 of CDBG expenditures for these programs.
- The Henrico ESG program served 409 households/persons through homeless prevention services at a cost of \$14,500; 7 households through rapid re-housing services at a cost of \$29,940; and 108 persons (14 by Housing Families First; 94 by CARITAS) through case management and shelter services at a cost of \$62,000 ESG.
- Children and adults in low to moderate income populations benefited from the completion of one public facility the CARITAS Center was completed and reported 118 persons served during PY19. Funding was provided through PY17 funds of \$100,000 CDBG.
- Prior to the end of the Program Year, CDBG-CV funds were expende to assist formerly incarcerated persons with housing and other needs through OAR of Richmond; provide

forclosure prevention assistance through HOME Inc.; provide crisis counseling through Commonwealth Catholic Charities. ESG-CV funds were expended to assist homeless persons and families persons at risk of homelessness All persons benefitting through the expenditure of these funds were assisted through programs designed to prepare for or respond to the coronavirus.

#### Narrative

The numbers in the CDBG column in Table 2 above reflect only non-housing activities including CONNECT, Enterprise Zone Design Assistance, Commercial Assistance Program, and Circle Center HVAC replacements. Households served through housing activities adds another 23White households, 93 Black/African American households, 1 Asian household, 1 Native American or American Indian household, 4 other multi-racial households, and 3 Black/African American and White households. Out of those households, 1 identified as Hispanic.

In PY2019-20, the majority of families/individuals assisted were non-white minorities. For CDBG, 86% of those assisted (non-housing and housing activities) were racial minorities. For HOME, 73% of those assisted were racial minorities. For ESG, 86% of those assisted were racial minorities. Overall, the County's population is 49.1% racial minorities.

#### Narrative

Table 3- "Resources Made Available" reflects PY 2019-20 allocations plus prior year funds brought forward and prior year program income (HOME only). These figures reflect the additional funds provided in the May 12, 2020, and September 22, 2020, amendments to the *2019 Action Plan*. "Amount Expended" for **CDBG** reflects draws that were all associated with expenses that occurred during PY 2019-20. Included in this total are \$189,580.08 in draws that occurred after the end of the program year and assigned to the prior year (2018). Sources and expended totals do not include CDBG-CV funds.

"Amount Expended" for **HOME** reflects draws that occurred during PY 2019-20, some of which were associated with activities and expenses from 2018. Draws were associated with grant funds from primarily 2019, but also 2016, 2017, and 2018. Not reflected in the total in Table 3 are 2019 grant funds expended (drawn) in the first few months of PY 2020 which may have been associated with activities completed in 2019. The amount drawn is based on the LOCCS Send Date as reported on the PR-07

"Amount Expended" for **ESG** reflects draws that occurred during the program year. Of the total drawn, a total of \$40,598.44 was Grant Year 2018 funds drawn (mostly) in the beginning of the 2019 program year.

Information for amounts expended was derived from PR-07 reports, *Drawdown Report by Voucher* Number – Vouchers Submitted to LOCCS.

Other Funds are ESG-CV and CDBG-CV funds

\$71,644 of HOME Program Income was received and expended (drawn) during the program year.

#### Leveraging

Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.

The use of federal CDBG and HOME funds by Henrico County leveraged over \$4,294,718 in state, local, federal, and private funds (computed as applicable Nondepartmental budget allocations plus HOME and ESG match contributed during the program year). Sources of leveraged funds included \$3,827,519 of FY2020-21 local funds from the Henrico County Nondepartmental budget and the budgets of the Departments of Building Inspections and Community Revitalization. Several agencies operate their programs in publicly-owned facilities or on publicly-owned lands. Agencies supported are as follows:

For FY 2019-20 Henrico County Public Schools (HCPS) was in final year of a 3-year grant under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Act. The award amount is \$68,000 for each of the years in the 3-year grant cycle, continuing through year 2019-20. In addition to the \$68,000 budgeted for 2019-20, we received additional funding to bring our year 3 budget to a total of \$95,000.

Henrico County served 935 homeless students in the 2019-20 school year, a decrease of 185 students over the previous year. This was a significant change from the previous year and was attributed in large part to the Covid-19 pandemic and the moratorium on evictions. HCPS Office of Federal Programs continues to provide Title 1 "set-aside" funds to support students whose families are experiencing homelessness.

Several agencies issue Housing Choice Vouchers that are used in Henrico County. The Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority administers 1,599 vouchers where households reside in Henrico County (Source: HUD Community Assessment Reporting Tool (CART), <u>https://egis.hud.gov/cart/</u>). Vouchers area also issued and managed by Richmond Residential Services for adults with intellectual disabilities through the HUD Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) program, Henrico Area Mental Health & Developmental Services (HAMHDS) and the Central Virginia Resource Corporation (CVRC) which are in used in Henrico County and throughout the metropolitan area.

Henrico County owns the land and building used by Housing Families First as a shelter and administrative offices for a rapid rehousing program. The \$171,500 of CDBG funds for the Connect program leveraged approximately \$430,000 of County general funds and in-kind contributions of space from several apartment communities.

Table 11 --The "one-year goal" numbers represent: 1,408 persons served with rapid re-housing, or homelessness prevention; 183 households served through moderate housing rehabilitation, minor home repair, down payment assistance, and the production of new units.

"Actual" numbers result from the following: 497 persons served through the YWCA hotline and Commonwealth Catholic Charities (homeless prevention and outreach), 7 persons served with rapid rehousing through HomeAgain, 17 persons assisted with renatl assistance through Henrico County Department of Social Services, one person assisted through Henrico Area Mental Health & Development Services, and 209 persons served through shelter operations from CARITAS, Homeward, and Housing Families First, for a total of 731. 66 households were served with emergency or minor repair, 12 households were served with moderate housing rehabilitation, 10 households provided down payment assistance, and one household provided affordable housing through CHDO developed projects, for a total of 89 providing a grand total of 820.

Table 12 -- The above 'Actual' numbers represent: 7 households provided rapid re-housing, 17 persons provided with rental assistance, and one household provided with rent or utility assistance (rental assistance); 1 household provided with production of a new unit; 78 households provided with homeowner rehab or repair; and 10 down payments assistance grants for first-time homebuyers (acquisition of existing units). The difference in production of new units is due to the Cool Lane Apartments project not being due to be completed until 2022. The original number in the One-Year Goal for "Number of households supported through Rental Assistance" did not include projects through Henrico County Department of Social Services and Henrico Area Mental Health & Development Services, which have been added to the accomplishment data in this table.

#### Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.

Given the success with the homeowner repair and rehabilitation programs, little change is expected. Performance of all programs is closely monitored so that mid-year program adjustments and reallocations can be made. Allocations will be reduced in future Action Plans for subrecipients who are unable to fully met their expectations and spend the funds allocated. Subrecipients who demonstrate they are able meet their goals and spend all funds are considered for additional funding in fugure years. A low performing subrecipient was not funded again in 2019-20 and a partnership was developed with a new subrecipient.

During 2019-20 Henrico County funded non-profit corporations through the Non-Departmental component of the General Fund budget to prevent homelessness, provide case management and food and shelter for homeless individuals, provide supportive services for homelessness and at risk of homelessness individuals and families, and enable the transition to permanent housing.

Federally funded ESG services provided during 2019-20 program year were:

- Housing Families First provided emergency shelter to 14 families.
- CARITAS provided support services and emergency shelter to 94 individuals
- YWCA provided emergency safe housing, counseling, case management, transition housing, rapid re-housing, and/or financial assistance to 409 Henrico individuals or families.

Commonwealth Catholic Charities provided street outreach to 52 individuals

#### Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

During PY 2019-20, Henrico County utilized ESG funding for the following program components:

- Shelter
- Homeless Prevention
- Rapid Re-housing
- Data Collection (HMIS)
- Administration
- Street Outreach

Shelter received 43.16% of the allocation followed by Rapid Re-housing with 20.84% of the allocation, Homeless Prevention received 10.09% of the allocation, Street Outreach received 16.71% of the allocation and Data Collection (HMIS) with 1.74% of the allocation. 99.44% of the PY 2019-20 ESG grant was expended.

The funds enabled homeless prevention activities for 461 persons, rapid re-housing activities for 19 persons/households, street outreach for 78 persons and shelter for 108 persons.

# Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after

being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

Henrico County's Department of Social Services (HDSS) created the Services Intake Unit (SIU) in 2010 to assist families and individuals in crisis. SIU performs intake functions for both Child Protective Service and Adult Protective Services. SIU also responds to emergency needs requests by providing information and referral services, homelessness prevention, and financial assistance. Citizens and agencies contact ICRU for a wide variety of emergency needs that can include housing, utilities, food, clothing, and medical. A trained staff person conducts a brief assessment, discusses how to engage informal supports, shares information about existing community resources, and problem solves with the individual to identify solutions. Qualified persons received financial assistance with short term rental and utilities with the goals of promoting safe and stable housing and improving self-sufficiency. In the period from June 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020, the Services Intake Unit completed 1,366 Child Protective Services referrals, 912 Adult Protective Services referrals, and 955 screening requests. HDSS also responded to 1,961 emergency needs requests, and provided financial assistance to 87 households.

HDSS relies on the support of HEARTH of Henrico to provide homeless prevention assistance. Of the 87 total households who received financial assistance, 74 households were served with funds provided wholly or in-part by HEARTH of Henrico.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

ESG funds enabled homeless prevention activities for 461 persons, rapid-re-housing activities for 19 persons/households, street outreach for 78 persons and shelter for 108 persons. The allocation to six organizations helped Henrico County serve a total of 686 persons/households.

### CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

#### Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The County of Henrico has no public housing. Henrico County encourages affordable homeownership for low-income households through several programs. Specific actions during PY 2019-20 to remove barriers and promote affordable housing include the following:

- Allocation of \$125,000 to HOME Inc. for down payment and closing costs assistance and homeownership counseling.
- Allocation of \$83,000 to Southside Community Development and Housing Corporation for down payment and closing costs assistance and homeownership counseling.
- Allocation of \$571,500 to project: HOMES for Critical Home Repairs.
- Allocation of \$25,000 to Rebuilding Together Richmond for a Home Repair Program.
- Allocation of \$628,151 to project: HOMES for the moderate home rehabilitation program.
- Allocation of \$129.000 for CHDO activities to create new affordable housing.

# Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

The County of Henrico has no public housing.

#### Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

The County of Henrico has no public housing.

### CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

Henrico County works in numerous ways to reduce the barriers to affordable housing. Building codes and tax policies are governed by state law and not subject to local adjustment but the County continues to provide an exemption from real estate taxes for low/moderate-income seniors and disabled homeowners through the Real Estate Advantage Program (REAP). Henrico reduces barriers to residential development of all types by not requiring cash proffers. The real estate tax rate in Henrico County is among the lowest in the region, and is the lowest among large urban localities in Virginia. The Comprehensive Plan designates substantial area for residential development and Henrico County regularly approves new subdivisions and multi-family development for all income levels. During County Fiscal Year 2019-20, permits were issued for 800 new single-family homes (a decrease of 13% from the prior year and down 25% over two years); 210 permits were issued for two-family buildings, an increase of 91% from the prior year. Three permits were issued for multi-family buildings, a decrease of 505 from the prior year.

The Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI), prepared by a consultant independent from Henrico County and completed in September 2015, identified no impediments to fair housing choice resulting from the negative effects of public policies. The development of a new AI is currently underway and will be completed by February 2021

A analysis undertaken in PY 2016 as part of the development of the 2016 Consolidated Plan and the 2016-17 Action Plan evaluated the opportunities for affordable housing for Henrico home purchasers. That analysis determined that 55% of the single-family homes in the County were affordable by households earning up to 80% Area Median Income, if available for purchase. This is a decrease from 2015 when 62% fell into this category. The *Richmond Regional Housing Framework*, prepared by the Partnership for Housing Affordability in January 2020, identified housing needs and challenges in the Richmond Region as well as Henrico County specifically. The *Framework* provided five "goals" and six general "solutions" for Henrico

Within the rental housing market there are 2,249 units supported by project-based housing choice vouchers or equivalent, providing housing opportunities for very low income households, and according to HUD e-Cart data (https://egis.hud.gov/cart/#), there 1,599 portable housing choice vouchers in use in Henrico County. There are also 3,704 additional rental units supported by low income housing tax credits (including 179 units under construction and not yet completed; and additional rent restricted units supported by tax exempt bond financing. There are currently 5,729 LIHTC supported housing units in Henrico within 46 apartment communities.

#### Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

While there are several constraints to meeting the needs of low-, very low-, and moderate-income

residents, the primary obstacle is the lack of funding to fully address all needs. In response to the level of need, Henrico County continued to provide local funding to non-profit agencies through the general fund non-departmental budget. The County provided homeless prevention services and assistance for County residents, and continued on a County-wide basis to encourage economic development leading to job growth, much of which is targeted to low-, very low-, and moderate-income persons. Through the Henrico Area Mental Health and Development Services, the County continued to administer Housing Choice Vouchers for 252 families. The County also encouraged all types of residential development and has been supportive of the use of low-income housing tax credits for the rehabilitation of multi-family housing for low- and moderate-income persons. For the 2019-20 Program Year, Henrico County continued to address its greatest need, addressing the condition of existing housing of low-income homeowners. During PY 2019-20, 78 households received housing repair or rehabilitation assistance through the County's program partners.

During PY 2019, Henrico County allocated \$54,000 in ESG and ESG-CV funding for homeless outreach and served persons through a non-profit partner, and allocated CDBG funds to that same partner for homelessness prevention. To encourage and provide opportunities for new low- and moderate-income homebuyers, down payment and closing cost assistance was provided to 10 households.

Two apartment projects in Henrico County received allocations of Low-Income Housing Tax Credits from the Virginia Housing Development Authority in 2020: Kingsridge III received an allocation for 24 units of new construction, and the Cool Lane Apartments received an allocation for 86 accessible units for an adaptive reuse project.

#### Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

As referenced in the Annual Action Plan, Henrico County provides up to \$5,000 for lead-based paint assessment and abatement for homes receiving assistance through the moderate rehabilitation program.

All CDBG and HOME activities in Henrico County which involve the purchase or repair/renovation of houses built prior to 1978 follow federal lead-based paint regulations. During the implementation of these activities, appropriate steps are taken depending on the level of funding for the unit when lead-based paint is detected or presumed to be present. Subrecipient staff is trained on lead-based paint requirements (HUD Lead Safe Work Practice Certification; EPA Renovation, Repair and Painting Certification; and Healthy Homes for Community Health Worker Certification) and practices and each homeowner in a pre-1978 home is provided the EPA/HUD booklet Protect Your Family From Lead in Your Home. Homeowners in repair/rehabilitation programs also receive the EPA booklet "The Lead-Safe Certified Guide to Renovate Right." A signature noting receipt of these documents is placed in each client file. Contractors used for repair/rehabilitation work are all EPA-certified under 40CFR Part 745.82 and 745.84.

#### Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Commercial Assistance Program, the Enterprise Zone Façade Grant program, and the Enterprise Zone Design Assistance program facilitate development and expansion of businesses to create jobs available to low- and moderate-income persons including persons in poverty. During the 2019 program year, CDBG-CV funds were used to assist microenterprise businesses that had been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, helping to stabilize small businesses with fewer than 5 employees (including the owner).

According to the 2013-2018 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates, 668 persons were removed from poverty during this time. More recent data is not available to evaluate reductions in the number of poverty level persons or families during the program year.

#### Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The County has designated staff to administer the programs and activities funded with CDBG, HOME and ESG funds. Staff works with the individual County Departments, including Public Works, Social Services, Recreation and Parks, Mental Health, Planning, Public Utilities, Building Inspections, and the Division of Community Maintenance to coordinate administration of programs to be carried out. Staff regularly tracks the production and effectiveness of County agencies, and subrecipients tasked with implementing programs with CDBG, HOME, and ESG funds. Program staff regularly meet to discuss program implementation, enhancements, and adjustments with these agencies. Of particular significance has been the participation on committees of the Continuum of Care. During the 2019-20 program year ESG funds and County staff continued to build and foster relationships with homeless service providers and coordinating agencies.

# Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Actions taken included:

- Continued participation as an active partner in the Richmond Region Continuum of Care, addressing homeless issues in the metropolitan area.
- Continued policy of no cash proffers for the development of new single-family houses to ensure greater affordability.
- Provided funds for down-payment and closing costs assistance to facilitate homeownership opportunities for low-income individuals.
- Regular communications and discussions with all currently-funded housing providers and others.
- Continued the Real Estate Investment Tax Abatement program for houses assessed at \$300,000 or less in value to increase affordability.
- Convened a monthly meeting of multiple County agencies (Resource Team) involved in addressing housing, social service, safety, and mental health needs of predominantly low-income Henrico residents.
- Continued representation on the regional non-profit Partnership for Housing Affordability
- Participated in the bi-monthly meeting of the Richmond Community Development Alliance

fostering coordination among Richmond area housing non-profits and the three entitlement jurisdictions.

• Representation on the Continuum of Care Board and the Ranking Committee

# Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

In September 2015, a consultant working for Henrico County completed a new *Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice*. (AI) *The analysis* identified five categories of impediments with sixteen remedial actions recommended to the County, some as "conceptual frameworks" for further research. Impediments and actions taken during PY 2019-20 are provided below. The development of a new AI is underway and scheduled for completion in February 2021.

- 1. *Continue to support production of affordable housing with CHDO funds.* In PY19-20 Henrico County allocated \$129,000 for CHDO activities.
- 2. Support non-profit partners to facilitate access to below-market rate units. In PY19-20, Henrico County allocated HOME funds for 22 down payment assistance grants for low-income first time homebuyers.
- 3. *Support non-profit partners that maintain relationships with lenders.* In PY19-20, four such partners were supported through funding.
- 4. Support development and seek additional sources of funds for affordable housing. Application was made to the Va. Dept. of Housing and Community Development for funding through the ARS program, however grant terms were unworkable so funding was declined.
- 5. *Encourage private sector support for LIHTC and AHP.* No projects specifically applied for Henrico County support for their LIHTC application. Two projects did receive tax credit allocations in Henrico for the 2020 allocation round.
- 6. Inadequate Awareness of Fair Housing Rights. For PY19-20, Henrico County funded HOME, Inc. to undertake fair housing outreach and education in Henrico. 2020-21 funding was provided to HOME Inc for housing stability and eviction prevention activities
- 7. *Partner with local industry to conduct outreach and education regarding fair housing.* See item 6 above.
- 8. *Encourage Fair Housing Enforcement Agencies and HUD to increase fair housing testing.* These are ongoing activities of these agencies. HOME Inc. has a strong testing program in central Virginia.
- 9. *Expand Routes for Public transportation.* In 2016-17, Henrico County made a substantial financial commitment to the Broad Street Bus Rapid Transit (the "Pulse") that extended into Henrico County and became operational in spring 2018. Beginning with the 2018-19 County general fund budget, funding was increased for expanded GRTC bus transit service in the County.
- 10. Apply for funding for financial literacy. This is an ongoing activity of several County agencies. The Junior Achievement Finance Park opened in October 2017 in the Libbie Mill Library. Henrico County provided the third floor of the new library and roughing out of the space.
- 11. Request the State to encourage lenders to offer assistance programs for households with predatory loans. This issue was addressed with the State in PY 2016-17.
- 12. Provide language assistance to persons with LEP. Translation services are offered primarily

through the services of Language Line for translation. In PY 2018-19 HOME Inc. focused much of its CDBG-funded fair housing outreach to immigrant communities, participating in World Refugee Day, Spanish language radio ads, and housing brochures in multiple languages.

- 13. Encourage recruitment of industry providing living wages. The County's Economic Development Authority (EDA) continuously recruits such employers. In Fiscal Year 2019-20, the Henrico EDA through its business recruitment program facilitated a capital investment of over \$814.3 million which resulted in the creation of 1,090 jobs. These jobs were located throughout the County in all income areas.
- 14. Support Development that provides alternative housing choices. In PY2019-20 and PY20-21, a total of \$400,000 of CDBG funds was allocated towards the development of additional supportive housing units for homeless and disabled individuals. Funding was allocated to Virginia Supportive Housing
- 15. Support homeless prevention and rapid re-housing. In PY19-20, a total of \$75,440 of ESG and CDBG funds was allocated for these purposes.
- 16. *Continue self-help programs.* The County suspended the Operation Paintbrush housing program in PY 2019-20, primarily due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The other volunteer assistance programs providing 2,119 hours of assistance in PY 2019-20.

### CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230

Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements

Monitoring activities included a review of a sampling of program activities completed during the contract period. Indiidual project files for the reviewed subrecipient were evaluated to ensure compliance with HUD regulations, County requirements, other applicable standards as well as the approved project plans (for construction projects), compliance with environmental review requirements, and compliance with fair housing laws. Monitoring visits are conducted in the spring, and are attended by the representatives of the nonprofit staff, a representative from Henrico County's Department of Finance, and the Program Manager for the CDBG, HOME, or ESG program as appropriate. For construction and CHDO projects, invoices and billing records are reviewed to ensure that expenses incurred reflect the expenses charged to the project.

Monitoring results are provided in writing to subrecipients, first in draft form for review and comment. A final report is prepared within 30 days of receiving comment including, any necessary findings or concerns along with any required or recommended corrective actions.

County staff reviewed eligibility documentation for compliance with applicable program regulations including client eligibility, proposed property improvements, need for service as projects or undertaken.

The required organization structure, capacity, and financial status of CHDO's is reviewed whenever certification is required for a project.

In general, checklists and review procedures are implemented in accordance with HUD's *Community Planning and Development Monitoring Handbook*, February 2017.

All funding recipients are required to submit monthly reports detailing the status of all activities throughout the program year. County staff reviewed each monthly report for financial and programmatic accuracy and program progress. Site monitoring occurs regularly for construction projects while underway, and prior to construction and upon completion for rehabilitation and repair projects. For all projects and programs, as compliance issues arise during the year, immediate corrective actions are required of subrecipients and CHDO's.

All sub-recipients and users of Enterprise Zone grant funds are required to follow County procurement processes. These require solicitation of bids from WMBE firms for most purchases.

Formal monitoring was not undertaken during calendar year 2020 due to pandemic contact restrictions, and site visits were substantially reduced.

Notice of the availability of a draft annual performance report was published in the Richmond Times-Dispatch on December 9, 2020. Citizens were given 15 days to review and provide comment on the document. The draft report was published on the County's website. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, hard copies of the document were not provided for review.

No comments were received during the 15-day comment period.

The County's Citizen Participation Plan was updated on May 1, 2020 to reflect reflect new federal requirements that allow shorter public comment periods during periods of national, state, or local emergency and to also allow for virtual public meetings. These shorter comment periods were not used for the public comment period for thisw CAPER.

Two amendments were made to the 2019 Action Plan during the program year.

The first amendment was finalized on May 12, 2020 to incorporate CDBG-CV in the amount of \$1,017,678 and ESG-CV funds in the amount of \$508,566 and to program these funds to 18 projects.

The second amendment was finalized on September 22, 2020 to incorporate HOME program income received during the year in the amount of \$37,054, prior year HOME funds brought forward in the amount of \$16,247, and additional ESG-CV funds appropriated by HUD in the amount of \$1,154,186. The additional HOME funds were allocated to the project:HOMES Home Rehabilitation Program. ESG-CV funds were allocated to existing and new projects.

# Describe other actions taken to foster and maintain affordable housing. 91.220(k) (STATES ONLY: Including the coordination of LIHTC with the development of affordable housing). 91.320(j)

The CDBG- and HOME-funded projects completed during PY 2018-19 provided down payment assistance, minor home repairs, and moderate home rehabilitation. The projects fostered and maintained affordable housing in Henrico County for low- and moderate-income residents. In PY2019-20 funds were provided that enabled the completion of twelve moderate rehabilitation projects, 66 critical home repair projects, and ten down payment assistance grants. All of these programs and projects are ongoing and have been renewed with PY 2020-21-20 funds. Two proposed multi-family developments in Henrico County sought Low Income Housing Tax credits for the construction of new housing units. Both received an allocation of tax credits through VHDA. Kingsridge III will contain 24 units in a mixture of one, two, and three bedroom units. The Cool Lane Apartments will contain 86 units of supportive housing as part of an adaptive reuse project For the 2020-20 Program Year, an additional \$150,000 in CDBG funds was allocated for the Cool Lane Apartments.

# **11.** Project Outcomes Data measured under the performance standards developed in consultation with the CoC(s)

The data below provide totals and averages for agencies provided ESG funding by Henrico County based on all clients served (not just those identifying as being from Henrico).

The Greater Richmond Continuum of Care adopted performance measures for 2017, three of which are applicable to programs funded with Henrico County ESG funds. The HMIS staff run APR reports quarterly for review by the funded agencies and provides this information to the Project Development Manager. With the exception of providers primarily serving survivors of domestic violence, all programs use HMIS to collect data and monitor program outcomes. Measures and outcomes are as follows:

- Exits to permanent destinations: 46.0%
- Average length of stay (system leavers): 53 days
- Returns to homelessness (after exit to permanent destination): 14.0%

The Greater Richmond Continuum of Care (GRCoC) tracks HEARTH Act system level performance measures for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development. In addition, the GRCoC board regularly seeks public comments and reviews the system performance measures and indicators developed by the GRCoC Performance Measurement and Ranking Committees. The CoC uses the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) to report on HEARTH outcomes and provides data for CAPER reports.

The system level performance measures and project level performance measures are used to review and rank applications for federal and state funding for homeless services. ESG staff participates in this ranking and review process. The GRCoC Ranking Committee advises all entitlement jurisdictions within the CoC on performance and alignment with community goals.

Overall, the number of people experiencing homelessness in the CoC had been consistently decreasing since the peak in 2009; however, we did see an increase from 2019 (497 people) to 2020 (546 people). The increase was likely due to an enhanced ability to find people living in unsheltered conditions due to the raising of a fairly large encampment in late 2019. In spite of this increase, the community continues

to make progress in placing people in safe shelter in the midst of a pandemic. In 2018, the GRCoC worked to change its coordinated entry system to meet federal regulations and to meet community needs. The Homeless Crisis Line (HCL) is the largest Access Point for homeless services in the Greater Richmond Continuum of Care (GRCoC). The HCL provides safety planning, diversion, and connections to temporary options for individuals and families at risk of or experiencing homelessness throughout the GRCoC. The HCL currently receives an average of 4,000 phone calls per month.
