Henrico County, Virginia is a well-planned community of 244 square miles of beautiful residential neighborhoods, expanses of fertile farmland and attractively designed commercial developments. It borders the City of Richmond to the south and lies between the James and Chickahominy Rivers.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Minimum 18 years of age.
- High school graduate or equivalent.
- Possession of a valid Operator's License with a Department of Motor Vehicle record of no more than 6 demerit points in 1 year.
- Use of tobacco products on and off duty are prohibited upon the date of hire.
- Applicants cannot have a DUI conviction within the last 12 months.

T TRAINING



The role of a Henrico firefighter has evolved to include tasks ranging from water emergencies to hazardous materials. We ensure our firefighters are trained to respond to various emergencies through our recruit school. Topics covered are:

- Firefighting
- Self-contained Breathing Apparatus
- Prehospital Medical Care
- Heavy Rescue
- Safety and Survival
- Fire Cause Investigation
- Hazardous Material Response
- Fire Code Inspection

WORK SCHEDULE

Firefighters work a total of seven 24 hour shifts every 21 days, (nights, weekends and holidays) which equates to approximately ten 24 hour workdays per month. Forty hour assignments are also available in Investigations, Inspections, Training, and Public Education.
