

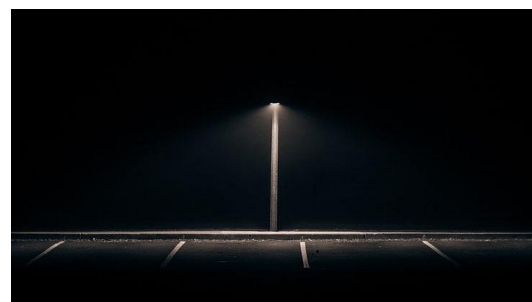


LARCENY FROM VEHICLES

→ SECURE YOUR VEHICLE TO AVOID BEING A VICTIM OF THIS CRIME

Tips to for keeping your vehicle secured

- Keep your vehicle locked—even when at home.
 - In 2025, **751** cars were broken into in Henrico County; **58%** were unlocked.
- Avoid storing valuables in your vehicle.
- DO NOT store any identification cards/papers in your vehicle. If thieves get such items, they may also steal your identity!
- If you are shopping, lock items out of sight in the trunk.
- If your vehicle does not have a trunk, place them under seats or otherwise out of sight.
- DO NOT keep your spare keys or key fob in your car.
- Consult with your insurance company on best practices for maintaining records on any valuables.
- Park in a well-lit area at night.
- Watch for and report any suspicious activity or people.
- Communicate with your neighbors.
- Be active in your Neighborhood Crime Watch group.



Stop, Lock, Look

Henrico Police strongly encourages drivers to remember the “Stop, Lock, Look” phrase.

- Stop – thieves from stealing your property.
- Lock – your property (including your home, vehicles and tool sheds).
- Look – at your surroundings and report suspicious activity.

Property Crimes

Property crimes affect more citizens in Henrico County than any other crime.

COMMONLY STOLEN ITEMS:

- Purses, backpacks
- Wallets/checkbooks

- Identification
- Tools
- Guns
- Cell phones
- Money/credit cards
- Sporting equipment
- Electronics
