Project Description

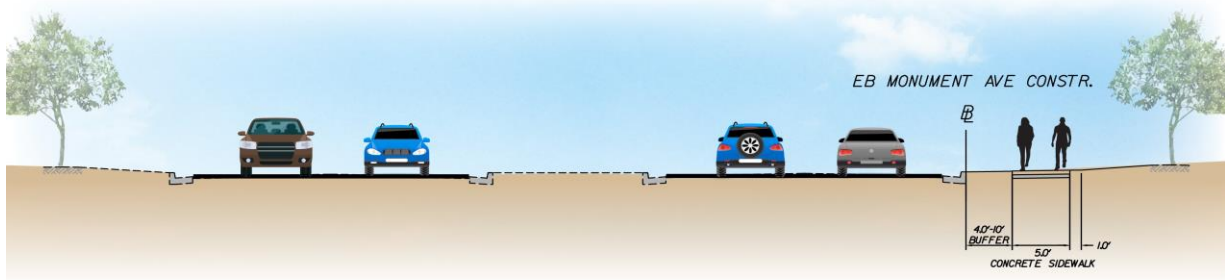
Henrico County is proposing to improve 0.44 miles of Monument Avenue to provide a five-foot sidewalk along the eastbound side of Monument Avenue between Bremono Road to Treboyn Avenue. The project includes median improvements, ADA-curb ramps, private entrances, and sidewalk along the corridor. Pedestrian crossings with push buttons and count down timers will be provided at each signalized intersection.

Right of Way

Displays at this meeting show the extent of right of way that will be needed as the project is currently proposed. Property owners will be informed of the exact location of the easements during the right of way acquisition process and prior to construction.

Project Overview

Location:

Monument Avenue from Bremono Road to Treboya Avenue

Purpose:

To improve pedestrian accommodations and improve safety along Monument Avenue.

Anticipated Cost:

\$2,500,000

Anticipated Schedule:

Right of Way Acquisition: March 2025

Utility Relocation: May 2026

Begin Construction: Spring 2027

Project Completion: Fall 2027

Environmental Review

The County has performed environmental reviews and coordination to obtain information about environmental resources in the project vicinity; to provide natural and historic resource agencies an opportunity to review and comment on the project during its development, and to identify opportunities for avoidance, minimization and mitigation of potential environmental impacts.

The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) is applicable to this project and a NEPA document has been developed in cooperation with VDOT and the Federal Highway Administration and in accordance with federal guidelines. The NEPA document includes information from various technical reviews including those related to natural resources, water quality, threatened and endangered species, air quality, noise, etc.

The project will continue to be coordinated with the appropriate federal, state, and local agencies as part of the environmental review and approval processes required throughout project development and construction. All required environmental clearances and permits will be obtained prior to commencement of construction. Strict compliance with all environmental conditions and commitments resulting from regulatory approvals, and implementation of the County's specifications and standard best practices will protect the environment during construction.

The NEPA document and the results of other environmental studies are available at today's meeting. Representatives from the County are available to discuss this information and to answer questions.

Civil Rights

Representatives from the County are present to discuss the project and answer your questions. It is the responsibility of the County to ensure that all members of the community are afforded the opportunity to provide comments and participate in public decisions on projects affecting them.
