#### **MANAGER'S COMMENTS**

There were no comments from the Manager.

#### **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS**

Mrs. O'Bannon recognized Don Stevens, owner of Stevens Jewelers, who presented each of the Board members and Mr. Hazelett with a package of six commemorative charms during the Board's November 23, 2010 special meeting. The charms are part of the store's Virginia and Richmond landmarks charms collection and depict the Henrico County seal as well as one special location in each of the County's five magisterial districts – the historic Courtney Road Service Station, the Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden/Arboretum, Short Pump, the Varina-Enon Bridge, and the James River. The presentation provided Mr. Stevens and his employees an opportunity to give thanks to the Board and Mr. Hazelett for their wonderful work.

Mrs. O'Bannon noted that the County's utility customers recently received a list of public events that have been scheduled for next year to commemorate the County's 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary. She expressed appreciation for the enthusiasm demonstrated by area businesses for the commemoration.

Mr. Thornton announced that the local chapter of the Police Athletic League (PAL) sponsored by the Henrico Division of Police donated turkeys to needy families and performed other volunteer services in the community on November 20, 2010. PAL is a national youth crime prevention program.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING - ITEMS**

Ordinance – To Amend and Reordain Section 20-74 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Partial exemption for rehabilitated, renovated or replacement multifamily residential rental units" to Extend the Time for Completion of Rehabilitation Projects Encompassing at Least 50 Contiguous Acres.

Tom Little, Real Estate Division Section Manager for the Department of Finance, responded to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this ordinance.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached ordinance.

276-10 Resolution - POD-15-10 (POD-16-82 Revised) - Approval of a Plan of Development for Brookland Middle School Renovations - Fairfield District.

Kevin Wilhite, Principal Planner for Development Review and Design, narrated a slide presentation highlighting the major aspects of the POD. He identified the location of this campus style school and the zoning districts for the 30.8-acre school site and surrounding properties. Mr. Wilhite reviewed the proposed improvements, which will include extensive interior renovations; several small mechanical building additions; a 1,200 square-foot library addition; reconstruction of the administration building entrance; a bus canopy; location of a generator and chiller unit; exterior changes to buildings; reconstruction of access drives, parking lots, sidewalks, and utilities; additional site lighting and landscaping; and a new underground stormwater retention facility. The project will be done in phases and will start in Spring 2011 with completion scheduled for Fall 2012. There will be a need for approximately one bathroom trailer and 24 classroom trailers on the site during the project.

Following his presentation, Mr. Wilhite responded to questions from the Board regarding the age of the school and the project's sidewalk reconstruction plans. Mr. Glover questioned the need to construct new sidewalks along Hungary Road and Lydell Drive. Chuck Graham of BCWH Architects responded to questions from the Board pertaining to the building's eligibility for tax credits, the school's design capacity and number of classrooms, and the impact of construction and temporary trailers on the learning environment. Mr. Thornton stated that he hoped that Henrico County Public Schools will collect and share data with the Board as to whether school renovation projects and the use of temporary trailers are injurious to education. Mr. Hazelett agreed to obtain documents requested by Mr. Donati concerning federal tax credit criteria for old buildings.

The following speakers addressed the Board during the public hearing:

 Michelle Brown, a resident of 9411 Battlefield Road in the Fairfield District, expressed concerns that the renovation project will not include a cafetorium. She responded to follow up questions from Mr. Kaechele. At Mr. Hazelett's request, Assistant Superintendent of Schools for Operations Ed Buzzelli responded to Ms. Brown's concerns. He elaborated on the school's master plan and funding limitations for the project. Mr. Hazelett and Mr. Buzzelli responded to questions from the Board relating to the status of bids and funding for the project, the number of existing cafeterias at the school, and the School Board's responsibility for prioritizing school projects. There were further comments by Ms. Brown, Mr. Glover, and Mr. Kaechele regarding the School Board's decision not to include a cafetorium in this project.

Tasha Holloman, the parent of an eighth grade daughter who attends
Brookland Middle School and a fifth grade daughter who attends
Longdale Elementary School, spoke of the need for a cafetorium at
Brookland Middle School in order for it to keep up with the schools
in western Henrico. She commented that the quality of schools in
Henrico should be equal in every way.

Mr. Buzzelli and Mr. Hazelett responded to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon pertaining to the next construction project on the School Board's list. In response to a question from Mr. Thornton, Mr. Hazelett explained the status of funding for this project and other 2005 general obligation bond referendum projects.

• Mrs. Holloman's older daughter, who did not identify herself, questioned why there is money to build new schools in western Henrico but not to renovate a 50-year old school. Mr. Hazelett explained the Board's obligation to meet projects approved by the citizens in the County's 2000 and 2005 general obligation bond referenda, noting that more money from these referenda was allocated to new schools in eastern Henrico than in western Henrico. He also referred to recent school renovation projects and the School Board's responsibility for projecting student populations and addressing current and future school needs and capacities.

Mr. Hazelett responded to a question from Mr. Glover concerning the amount of 2005 bond referendum funds allocated to eastern Henrico schools. Mr. Kaechele noted that the County has had to build schools where the majority of the growth in student population has occurred.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

(c) Application; determination of base value; application fee.

(2) The application to qualify for tax exemption shall be effective for three years from the date on which the director of finance determines the base value. If, by such expiration date, rehabilitation has not progressed to such a point that the assessed value of the structure is at least 50 percent greater than the base value of such structure, then to retain such eligibility a new application to qualify for tax exemption must be filed prior to the expiration date and a new base value established. In no event, however, shall there be more than two additional applications
following the initial application on any structure, except that where a rehabilitation project
encompasses at least 50 contiguous acres on which demolition of all structures takes place
within one year of the initial application, a total of four additional applications following the
initial application may be filed. The new base value shall be based upon the value of the
improvements as of the date of the second, or third, fourth or fifth application. Under no circumstances shall any new base value be less than the original base value.

2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage.

- 1. The Director of Public Utilities shall approve the construction plans for public water and sewer prior to beginning any construction of these utilities. The Department of Public Utilities shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the start of any County water or sewer construction.
- 2. The parking lot shall be subject to the requirements of Section 24-98 of the Henrico County Code.
- 3. The parking spaces shall be marked on the pavement surface with four-inch wide white painted traffic lines. All lane lines and parking lines shall be white in color with the exception that those dividing traffic shall be yellow.
- 4. Sufficient, effective usable parking shall be provided. If experience indicates the need, additional parking shall be provided.
- 5. Curb and gutter and necessary storm sewer shall be constructed as shown on approved plans.
- 6. The plan of development shall be revised as annotated on the staff plan dated November 23, 2010, which shall be as much a part of this approval as if its details were fully described herein. Eight (8) sets of revised plans, including the detailed drainage, erosion control and utility plans shall be submitted by the design engineer who prepared the plans to the Department of Planning for final review. Upon notice from the Department of Planning that all comments have been addressed, twenty-one (21) sets of final plans for signature shall be submitted to the Department of Planning for approval signatures.
- 7. The Department of Public Works shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the start of any construction.
- 8. Two copies of an Erosion and Sediment Control Agreement shall be submitted to the Department of Public Works. Approval is required prior to construction plan approval and beginning construction.
- 9. A detailed landscaping plan shall be submitted to the Department of Planning for review and approval prior to the issuance of any occupancy permits.
- 10. All ground cover and landscaping shall be properly maintained in a healthy condition at all times. Dead plant materials shall be removed within a reasonable time and replaced during the normal planting season.
- 11. Prior to the approval of an electrical permit application and installation of the site lighting equipment, a plan including light spread and intensity diagrams and fixture specifications and mounting height details shall be submitted for Department of Planning review and approval.
- 12. All exterior lighting shall be designed and arranged to direct the light and glare away from nearby residential property and streets.
- 13. The site, including the parking areas, shall be kept clean of litter and debris on a daily basis. Trash container units/litter receptacles and recycling containers shall be maintained with scheduled regular pickups and shall be screened properly on all four sides. The gate(s) shall remain closed except when the receptacle(s) are being filled or serviced and shall be repaired or replaced as necessary. Details shall be included with the final site plan or required landscape plan review and approval.
- 14. Required fire lanes shall be marked and maintained in accordance with the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code.


- 15. Traffic control signs shall be provided as indicated on the Planning staff plan. All signs shall be fabricated as shown in <u>The National Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways</u> and <u>The Virginia Supplement to The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways</u>.
- 16. The assigned property number shall be displayed so it is easily readable from the street. If assistance is needed with the address, please contact the Department of Planning at 501-4284. The Planning Department must assign all property addresses.
- 17. The contractor shall have a set of plans approved by the Director of Public Works, Director of Public Utilities and the County Manager available at the site at all times when work is being performed. A designated responsible employee shall be available for contact by County inspectors.
- 18. The property shall be developed generally as shown on the plan filed with the case and no major changes or additions to the layout shall be made without the approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- 19. Upon completion of the improvements and prior to the certification of the permanent occupancy permit, the engineer or land surveyor who prepared the POD plan shall furnish a statement to the effect that all construction, including water and sewer is in conformance with the regulations and requirements of the POD.
- 20. The developer shall provide fire hydrants as required by the Department of Public Utilities and Division of Fire.
- 21. Insurance Service Offices (ISO) calculations should be included on the final construction plans for approval by the Department of Public Utilities prior to issuance of a bullding permit.
- 22. Any necessary offsite drainage easements must be obtained in a form acceptable to the County Attorney prior to final approval of the construction plans by the Department of Public Works.
- 23. Deviations from County standards for pavement, curb, or curb and gutter design shall be approved by the County Engineer prior to final approval of the construction plans by the Department of Public Works.
- 24. Vehicles shall be parked only in approved and constructed parking spaces.
- 25. The construction shall be properly coordinated to ensure that safe access, eirculation and adequate parking is provided for the facility. A plan to indicate the phasing of improvements and the handling of traffic (construction and employees) shall be submitted to the Department of Planning prior to the issuance of a building permit.
- 26. The easements for drainage and utilities as shown on approved plans shall be granted to the County in a form acceptable to the County Attorney prior to any occupancy permits being issued. The easement plats and ony other required information shall be submitted to the County Real Property Agent at least sixty (60) days prior to requesting occupancy permits.
- 27. A concrete sidewalk meeting County standards shall be provided along the south line of Hungary Road and the west line of Lydell Drive where curb and gutter is located.




WHEREAS, as part of the required compensation, the County was required to restore and preserve a portion of the stream channel located within the boundaries of the County's Short Pump Park in the Three Chopt District (the "Property") under a proposed "John Rolfe Stream Restoration Compensation Plan" (the "Plan"); and,

WHEREAS, the environmental permitting agencies have required under the Plan that the County record a Declaration of Restrictions to create a perpetual "Stream Conservation Easement" to restore and preserve in perpentity and in its natural state 108,971 sq. ft. of the stream channel and the riparian corridor adjacent to the channel (the "Declaration of Restrictions") on a portion of the Property as shown on the attached Exhibit "A;" and,





WHEREAS, VDOT will pay all the costs of the upgrade and no local matching funds are required from Henrico County for the upgrade; and,

WHEREAS, the County will only be required to contribute one-half of the annual cost of maintenance of this equipment; and,

WHEREAS, the current annual maintenance cost of grade crossing protective devices of this type is \$1,975.00, and the County's share would be \$987.50.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Henrico County Board of Supervisors authorizes the County Manager to execute an agreement with VDOT and Buckingham Branch Railroad, in a form approved by the County Attorney, to upgrade the existing flashing lights and gates at the Richmond-Henrico Turnpike railroad grade crossing.
