COUNTY OF HENRICO, VIRGINIA BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REGULAR MEETING June 28, 2011

The Henrico County Board of Supervisors convened a regular meeting on Tuesday, June 28, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room, Administration Building, Henrico County Government Center, Parham and Hungary Spring Roads, Henrico County, Virginia.

Mr. Thornton called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

Mr. Thornton led recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Reverend Marcus D. Martin, Senior Pastor of New Bridge Baptist Church, delivered the invocation.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, the Board approved the minutes of the June 14, 2011 Regular and Special Meetings.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Hazelett advised that Mrs. O'Bannon was absent from the meeting due to an unforeseen vacation and reservations that could not be changed.

Henrico County, under the guidance of the Office of Emergency Management in the Division of Fire, has completed the process to become certified as "StormReady" by the National Weather Service. The application process for designation as a StormReady community involves a comprehensive review of policies, procedures, and systems designed to notify the public about weather-related emergencies and other disasters. The County's application included an emphasis on public outreach efforts such as the Henrico Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program and the County's ongoing partnership with the National Weather Service to offer SkyWarn spotter training for citizens. With the County's completion of this certification program, it has joined Chesterfield, Colonial Heights, Richmond, and Virginia Commonwealth University in taking the extra step to ensure that citizens and visitors in the Richmond metropolitan area are better prepared for weather-related emergencies. William Sammler, Warning Coordination Meteorologist with the National Weather Service office in Wakefield, Virginia, presented Henrico Fire Chief Edwin Smith and Emergency Management Deputy Coordinator Anna McRay with a plaque and two road signs recognizing Henrico County as a "StormReady" community.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Glover announced that several major youth baseball tournaments will be held during the next two months at RF&P Park in Glen Allen, including the American Legion Junior Virginia Baseball Championship and the Triple Crown United States Baseball Championships in late July and the Babe Ruth 14-Year-Old World Series in late August. He noted that a lot of volunteers are in place to make sure these tournaments happen and encouraged citizens to come out to RF&P Park and watch some good baseball.

Mr. Thornton acknowledged the recent passing of Michael Healy, who was actively involved with youth soccer in the Fairfield District and throughout the County.

Mr. Thornton recognized the following Boy Scouts who were observing the meeting to fulfill a requirement for the Citizenship in the Community Merit Badge: Conner Dragoo from Troop 529, sponsored by American Legion Battlefields Post 144; and Zheng Chen from Troop 799, sponsored by Trinity United Methodist Church.

Mark Strickler, Director of Community Revitalization, narrated a brief slide presentation on the consolidated plan for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investments Partnership Program (HOME) FY 2011-12 budget. He explained changes to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD's) allocations for these programs over the previous year, the number of funding requests received from outside organizations, those requests recommended for funding by staff, and sources and proposed uses of CDBG and HOME program funds.

Brenda Hicks, Director of the Center for Housing Education for Housing Opportunities Made Equal of Virginia, Inc., addressed the Board during the public hearing. She thanked the Board for its past support, asked for its continued support, and thanked the Department of Community Revitalization staff for helping her organization have a successful first time homebuyer program in Henrico County. Ms. Hicks noted how her organization is assisting first-time homebuyers, commented on the benefits of homeownership, and expressed hope that the Board will consider providing funds in the future for the organization's foreclosure prevention program, for which funding was not recommended.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

Ordinance - To Amend and Reordain Section 19-2 Titled "Definitions," Section 19-60 Titled "Required," Section 19-134 Titled "Lot frontage," and Section 24-9 Titled "Street frontage required," and to Add Division 4 Titled "Family subdivisions" and Consisting of Section 19-97 Titled "Required," Section 19-98 Titled "Family subdivision plat," Section 19-99 Titled "Review of plat; action by planning commission," Section 19-100 Titled "Standards for review," and Section 19-101 Titled "Recording," All of the Code of the County of Henrico to Regulate Family Subdivisions and Amend Street Frontage Requirements.

Ben Blankinship, Principal Planner, narrated a slide presentation titled *Proposed Amendment to Allow Family Subdivisions with No Public Street Frontage*. During his presentation, Mr. Blankinship reviewed the existing street frontage requirement in the County's zoning ordinance, public policy concerns relating to this requirement, the exception in the County Code for family divisions, two issues the Board asked the Planning Commission to address in remanding an earlier draft subdivision amendment to the Commission, proposed regulations and requirements included in the draft amendment brought back through the Commission for the Board's consideration, and differences in the draft amendment between the Commission's current recommendation and a consensus arrived at by the Board at a recent work session.

Mr. Blankinship, Mr. Hazelett, and Mr. Rapisarda responded to questions from the Board. There was discussion regarding the proposed construction standards for private drives serving new homes in family divisions.

Andrew Bristow, a resident of the Varina District, questioned the necessity of requiring that a family subdivision be served by an eighteen-foot paved road. Mr. Glover, Mr. Blankinship, and Mr. Kaechele responded to Mr. Bristow's concerns. Mr. Blankinship and Mr. Rapisarda responded to follow-up questions by the Board and elaborated on the impact of a 2004 decision by the Supreme Court of Virginia in *Cochran v. Fairfax County Board of Zoning Appeals* and how this case limits the authority of local boards of zoning appeals (BZAs) to grant variances, including those requested for family divisions.

Mr. Hazelett noted that he had for the Board's consideration a substitute ordinance labeled as agenda item 152A-11. He advised that the major differences between the ordinance recommended by the Planning Commission and this substitute was that the substitute changed the surface width of the required private drive from 24 feet to 18 feet and the

requirement that homes be within 1,320 feet of the public street to 1,000 feet.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved the substitution of ordinance 152A-11 for 152-11.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, with Mr. Donati voting no, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 152A-11 – see attached substitute ordinance.

Mr. Blankinship narrated a slide presentation titled *Refuse Containers: Hours of Servicing*. During his presentation, Mr. Blankinship reviewed the problem residents have experienced with enforcement of the noise ordinance, the definition of the term "refuse container," and current and proposed regulations addressing dumpster noise under the County's zoning ordinance.

Mr. Blankinship responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele.

Mr. Hazelett noted that he had for the Board's consideration a substitute ordinance labeled as agenda item 153A-11. The major difference between the ordinance recommended by the Planning Commission and this substitute was that the substitute prohibited the servicing of refuse containers between midnight and 6:00 a.m. in all zoning districts rather than some zoning districts as recommended by the Planning Commission.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to either the ordinance recommended by the Planning Commission or the substitute ordinance.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved the substitution of ordinance 153A-11 for 153-11.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 153A-11 – see attached substitute ordinance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Richard Flannigan, President of the Three Fountains North Civic Association, reiterated concerns presented at the last meeting by representatives of his association alleging that uncontrolled County stormwater and sediment is emptying into the association's private Lake Overton. Rudy Morgan, a resident of Three Fountains North, elaborated on the character of his community and joined Mr. Flannigan in requesting assistance from the County in cleaning up the lake.

Mr. Thornton thanked Mr. Flannigan and Mr. Morgan for their comments. He pointed out that it was expressed at the last Board meeting that the County would provide letters of support for a grant that the association is trying to obtain for the project. Mr. Hazelett stated that it was also indicated at the last meeting that the County would be glad to meet with the residents and provide written explanation to them of the County's position. He added that this is a situation occurring throughout the County and that the County will try its best to assist the community although because the lake is on private property there may be disagreements between the community and the County concerning what defines natural sediment.

WHEREAS, Henrico County is an entitlement community under the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") Program, as authorized by Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the County's CDBG entitlement is \$1,335,243 for Program Year Twenty-Two, and the County has prepared the attached objectives and proposed uses of CDBG entitlement funds for 2011-2012; and,

WHEREAS, the County is an entitlement community under the HUD Home Investment Partnership Program ("HOME") as authorized by the HOME Act of 1990, as amended; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that it: (1) approves the 2011-2012 Plan, including the proposed uses of CDBG and HOME funds for 2011-2012; (2) authorizes the County Manager to submit the Plan as required by law; and (3) authorizes the County Manager to execute the agreements and contracts necessary to implement the CDBG and HOME activities in a form approved by the County Attorney.

- 2. That Section 19-60 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

The family subdivision plat shall be prepared by a registered professional engineer or registered land surveyor authorized to do business in the state. The owner shall submit the number of copies required by the director of planning and an application for approval. The plat shall have a horizontal scale of 100 feet to the inch or other scale approved by the director of planning. The plat shall clearly show the following, as applicable:

- (a) The location and boundary lines of the land to be divided.
- (b) The name and address of the record owner of the land to be divided and the name and address of the person who prepared the plat.
- (c) The location and names of adjoining subdivisions or of the owners of adjoining parcels of land.
- (d) The location, width, and names of any proposed private drive; and the location, width, and names of all existing or platted streets within 300 feet of the property.
- (e) The location, width, and purpose of other rights-of-way and easements.
- (f) The location of physical features, such as buildings, streams, drainage ditches, floodplains, mapped dam break inundation zones, wetlands, and Chesapeake Bay Preservation Areas.
- (g) The Invouband dimensions of proposed lots.
- (h) Scale of the plat, north arrow (true meridian where practicable), date of the plat, and tax parcel number.
- (i) The proposed building setback lines and buildable area plans.
- (j) Four points with coordinates in the Virginia State Plane Coordinate System. All features shown on the plan must be drawn to scale based upon the four points.
- (k) Any monument of the Geodetic Caratrol Network located on the property.
- (I) Profiles along the center of any proposed private drive, indicating the type of construction and depth of materials.

- (s) The location of Chesaporake Bay Preservation Areas, including the bourwiaries of RPAs and RMAs, and a statement as follows: "AlLor a portion of this femily subdivision is located in a Chesapeake Bay Preservation Area, which is subject to the provisions of section 24-106.3 of the Hoerico County Code, or its successon."
- (t) A notation stating, "The 100-foot RPA buffer area consisting of vegetation that is effective in retarding runoff, proventing erosion, and filtering nonpoint source pollution is to be retained and remain undisturbed."

 - (1) If every lot to be used for dwelling purposes abuts a public street right-of-way for at least 50 feet, or is exempt from that requirement purposet to section 24-9(a)—(d), the director of planning shall note that the division is exempt from planning commission review. One cepy of the plat shall be retained in the planning dopartment files, and the remaining copies shall be returned to the applicant.

- (c) The property owner shall place a restrictive coverlant on the subdivided property that prohibits the transfer of the property except to a member of the immediate family for a period of five years.
- (d) Each lot shall be served by a public street or a private drive. The public street or private drive shall connect to an existing public street. Any private drive shall serve no more than three lots. Any private drive shall be located within a recorded easement or private right-of-way not less than 30 feet wide, unobstructed from the ground up, in addition, the plat shall designate utility easements as required by the department of public utilities.
- (e) All required private drives shall comply with the standards of Section 2 of the Department of Public Works Design Manual for sight distance, herizontal ourves, vertical curves, and points of access. On the advice of the county engineer, the commission may decrease or waive these standards to allow an alternative design that provides equal or greater traffic safety.
- (f) All trees, roots, vegetation, loam, humus, and other organic material shall be stripped to below the base course for the full width of the roadway and replaced with suitable fill material which shall be compacted in lifts not exceeding 12 inches in depth to a minimum CBR value of 10. Adequate drainage shall be provided to convey all surface runoff and groundwater away from the roadway.

The agreement shall be binding on the successors in interest of all signatories. The planning commission reay accept an agreement that lacks the signature of one or more lot owners if it finds the applicant has made a good-faith but or successful effort to obtain such signature.

- (a) Summerhouses, cabins, or camps as permitted by sections 24-51(c) or 24-88(f) need not abut a public street.
- (b) Every flag lot subject to section 24-95(r) shall abut a nublic nul-de-sac street for a minimum distance of 20 feet as provided in section 24-95(r)(5).
- (c) Every cul-de-sac lot shall abut a public cul-de-sac street for a minimum distance of 35 feet and shall be subject to the requirements of saction 24-95(v).
- (d) Every stem lot shall abut a public cul-de-sac street for a minimum distance of 20 feet and shall be subject to the requirements of section 24-95(w).
- (e) Lats created by family subdivision as provided in sections 19-97 through 19-101 need not abut a public street.


