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WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Defense provides grants under the Defense Community Infrastructure Program ("DCIP") to address deficiencies in community infrastructure that are supportive of a military installation, enhance military value, enhance installation resilience, enhance military family quality of life, and support the training of cadets at covered educational institutions; and,

WHEREAS, the County has identified the Beulah Road Relocation Project as an eligible project; and,
