Organizational Items and Agenda Review

Mr. Vithoukias welcomed the Board back from the holidays and introduced a few informational topics that would be reviewed with the Board.

Eric English, Chief of the Police Division, gave the Board a brief overview of year-end crime statistics. Chief English explained there was a 13% reduction in overall all crime this past year. At the request of Mrs. Roundtree, the Chief explained this year there has been one homicide in Varina, but that arrests have been made in that case. Mrs. Roundtree asked about recent burglaries in the Three Chopt area. The Chief noted these burglaries have slowed down, with the help of numerous patrols and new technology in the area.

Monica Smith-Callahan, Deputy County Manager for Community Affairs, updated the Board on homelessness in the region and explained the Caritas overflow shelter reached capacity because of the cold temperatures experienced in the beginning of December. Due to this increase in numbers, the County and City of Richmond have added an additional 60 nights for that shelter.


Mrs. Smith-Callahan next updated the Board on the Buddhist peace walk that is expected to travel through Henrico in the first week of February. The Police Division will offer support for crowd control and protection along the route.

Gilberto DeLeon, Assistant Director for the Department of Public Works, updated the Board on an impactful grant recently received for \$14.6 million to help with bike safety and pedestrian improvements in the County.

Andrew Newby, County Attorney, briefly reviewed the organizational meeting agenda items.

The Board wished Mr. Rogish a very happy birthday and celebrated with cake.
