Mr. Axselle - The location, if the school is available, is fine. I would hope that perhaps—we have delivered to Ben Sehl today the modified proffers that are the result—as you know, we've had three community meetings. And we have been gradually modifying the proffers, incorporating considerations the Planning staff and the community brought to us. At the first meeting, we had fifty to sixty people; the second one about twenty-five or so; and the last time sixteen. I have communicated with everybody who's on the County mailing list—190 people—and sent them materials in December and sent them a notice about this deferral.

If you want us to do it, we will. But quite frankly, I'm of the opinion that everything that can be done has been done that's realistic. There are two groups of neighbors, as you know. One who are upset with the schools having sold the property, although the schools had a public hearing and declared it surplus. And then there are others who are the more immediate neighbors who are concerned about it. We have put in I think about twenty-five proffers. At some point—we've moved the building. We've put everything—everything that's been asked of us we have done. And so I hope you maybe would—before you make that decision—look at the new proffers and check with the staff.

If you want one we can, but I've never in my career had three community meetings on a zoning case. But I would just ask that you look and talk with the staff before you make that request. If so, we'll do one.

Mrs. Marshall: Okay. Part of my reasoning is because the transition was quick between Mr. Branin and I, and even though I was at two of those meetings, I think it sends a negative message to the neighbors that it's a done deal, that Mrs. Marshall is going to come in and she's just going to agree with everything that's been going on. I think that we want to send a positive message to the neighbors. We can't make everybody happy; we all know that. But we want them to feel better about it, especially if it is coming.

The staff report will be 315 presented by Mr Ben Sehl. 316 317 To Amend and Reordain Article VIII of Chapter 24 of ORDINANCE -318 the Code of the County of Henrico Including Section 24-31.2 Titled "Submission 319 requirements" and Section 24-34 Titled "Development standards" and to Add 320 Section 24-92.4 Titled "Innsbrook Redevelopment overlay district," All to Create 321 the Innsbrook Redevelopment Overlay District and Revise the Urban Mixed Use 322 District to Modify Submission Requirements and Reduce the Minimum Acreage for 323 Mixed-Use and Pedestrian-Oriented Developments Within Areas Subject to the 324 2026 Comprehensive Plan Revisions Approved as Part of the Innsbrook Area 325 Study. 326 327 Mr. Archer -Mr. Sehl, how are you, sir? 328 329 Mr. Sehl -330 I'm well, thank you. 331 Mr. Chairman, this is a public hearing. This item was initiated at the Commission's 332 November 18th meeting and discussed in a work session on December 10th. 333 Another work session was held earlier this evening where minor revisions were

discussed to one section of the proposed changes regarding submission requirements.

Throughout this process, staff and the Commission have had several goals for this ordinance review. These included making sure that we limited any changes to the Innsbrook area itself. That was an area that was approved in 2010 as part of the Innsbrook Area Study, which was an amendment to the 2026 Comprehensive Plan. We also wanted to determine if a reduced acreage could be appropriate within that area and if all the currently required impact studies were still necessary.

These proposed revisions were discussed with the Commission and advertised for a public hearing. Those advertisements ran on December 28th and January 4th.

In order to achieve goal one of limiting the changes to the areas within Innsbrook, we are proposing a new overlay district. This would be called the Innsbrook Redevelopment Overlay District. This new section would follow the current overlay districts—the West Broad Street Overlay and Airport Safety Overlay districts—and would follow a similar description that defines the purpose of the overlay, establishes the boundary of the overlay district, and provides for certain other requirements for developments within those overlays.

The proposed ordinance would also reference the requirements and standards based on policies that were adopted as part of the Innsbrook Area Study and would address items such as building height, inter-parcel access, and development standards regarding design.

The Innsbrook Area Study would be used to establish the boundaries of the new overlay district. Rather than include the entire area of the Innsbrook study, staff is recommending it be further limited to the areas A, B, and C, as shown on the map in front of you. This is largely because, as we discussed earlier this evening, land bay D is recommended for Traditional Neighborhood Development on the Comprehensive Plan and the Future Land Use Map at this time. This means that the size of the new overlay district would encompass approximately 1,050 acres. For comparison, the West Broad Street Overlay District is about 1,700 acres.

Creating this new overlay would limit the changes to the UMU District for properties within Innsbrook, which achieves that first goal. That allows us to consider the proposed revisions to Section 24-34(a), which would reduce the minimum acreage for new UMUs to four within the Innsbrook Overlay District. This would allow properties on key corners at major intersections, which are well placed for future redevelopment, to file for rezoning without further assemblage of adjacent properties. Larger developments could and would still be possible and appropriate, but the proposed revision would allow for my incremental change toward the vision approved with the Innsbrook Area Study.

The third proposed revision will be to Section 24-31.2(b), which would remove the strict requirements for certain impact studies within the new overlay district, which could facilitate smaller projects. As we discussed this evening, these overlay studies wouldn't strictly be required, but they could still be required by the Director of Planning should it be determined that they are necessary because of the proposed densities, commercial uses, or building height. Because each property would still require rezoning, that analysis could be done, and it would still be brought before the Commission and Board as public hearing items before rezoning.

Because of these changes, staff does believe that the proposed revisions meet the goals that were initially discussed with both the Board of Supervisors and the Planning Commission, and we believe that the additional changes since your meeting in December have addressed the concerns, hopefully, that the Commission noted at that time. At this point, staff could recommend approval of the recommended revisions to the three sections noted previously with the ordinance in front of you dated January 14th, today. And we would recommend that you recommend to the Board of Supervisors that they consider and approve such changes.

That concludes my presentation. I'll be happy to try to answer any questions you might have at this time.

Mr. Archer - Thank you, Mr. Sehl. Are there questions from members of the Commission?

Mr. Sehl, I had one question. I meant to ask it when we had the work session. There's a condition that a property could be added if it was less than twenty acres or less than four acres provided there was a right-of-way of less than ninety feet.

Mr. Sehl - Yes sir.

Mr. Archer - And when I thought about the ninety feet, it sounded small at first, but that's the difference between home plate and first base. That's a right good size right-of-way. How did we come up with that?

Mr. Sehl - Mr. Archer, when we looked at the last revisions that were approved by the Board of Supervisors in 2011, I guess, when the last revision to the Urban Mixed-Use District was done, we looked at various urban mixed-use-designated properties in the County, areas that were designated for Urban Mixed-Use on the Future Land Use Map and the Comprehensive Plan. And we looked at roads that ran within those areas such as—at that point, the Innsbrook Area Study had been approved, so we looked at Cox Road and various locations. We looked at areas such as Staples Mill Road down by Libbie Mill, Bethlehem Road. So we looked at number of different road widths that were in there, and we thought that
