The Keep Henrico Beautiful Committee will again provide Christmas tree recycling for Henrico residents at two county sites from Friday, Dec. 26 through Friday, Jan. 9.

Residents may bring their trees to the lower parking lot at the Henrico Government Center, 4301 E. Parham Road, and to the front parking lot at the Eastern Government Center, 3820 Nine Mile Road. This free service is offered for residential use, not for commercial tree lots. Residents may also recycle trees free of charge at the public use areas at Springfield Road Landfill, Interstate 295 and Nuckols Road, and at Charles City Road Landfill, 2075 Charles City Road. County staff will help residents dispose trees from 7:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily through Saturday, Jan. 31. The Keep Henrico Beautiful program has received a national award for "Litter...It's Costly, It's Criminal, It's Careless," a new litter-prevention campaign targeting teenage drivers.

Keep America Beautiful, Inc. recognized the Henrico program with a Distinguished Service Citation National Award at its 50th national conference, held Dec. 5 in Washington, D.C. "Litter...It's Costly, It's Criminal, It's Careless" uses a driver-education video, informational brochures and formatted digital files to educate teenage drivers about the environmental, legal and safety risks posed by roadway litter. The campaign meets the Virginia Standards of Learning for driver education. Keep Henrico Beautiful developed, produced and implemented the campaign in partnership with several county agencies, including Public Relations & Media Services, Public Schools, Police and Recreation and Parks.

In addition to its national award, the campaign recently received a second-place award in the Litter Prevention-Government Agency category from the statewide Keep Virginia Beautiful program. Keep Henrico Beautiful is a division of the county's Department of Public Utilities.
