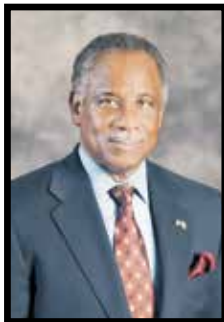
Welcome to Henrico County's Program Guide!
